Wellbeing & Citizenship

Look for resources with the white dot and then look for these subject markers on the shelves:

- o **Health & Wellbeing** - alcohol and substance abuse, eating disorders, understanding physical disabilities and dealing with physical illness, keeping fit and healthy
- o **Mental health** – self-confidence, depression, anxiety, emotions
- o **Puberty** – understanding what's happening to your body
- o **Relationships** - friendships, family and other relationships, abuse, coercion, bullying, staying safe, coping with social media
- o **Identity** – gender and equality
- o **Citizenship** – the law, your rights, housing, managing money, travel

Look at the display stand for leaflets to take away with up-to-date information and contact details of organisations which help young people.
