CAREERS EVENT



Students from Years 9 and 11 quizzed local employers about opportunities and career routes at a marketplace-style careers event held in the school hall in November 2019.

The students seized the opportunity to engage with twenty different employers and learning providers, finding out more about the qualities required to succeed in the workplace and the future learning opportunities available in a wide range of industries, including Financial Services, IT, Civil Service, Media, Sport and Engineering.

CAREERS PANEL



In October 2019 all of Years 9 and 10 attended back-to-back careers panels, which are a 'Question Time' style event, designed to give the students a chance to ask business professionals about careers in a range of industries.

The panel included people from Manufacturing, Engineering, Financial Services, Digital Marketing, Higher Education and a Franchisee. Questions were grouped into the following areas: career journey & job role; skills, qualities & qualifications; growth sectors and next steps; with students also taking the opportunity to ask questions of their own.

FUNCTIONAL WORKSHOP



In preparation for their mock interviews, which were held two weeks later, Year 12 students attended interview skills workshops in their form groups, delivered by a range of business professionals from KPMG, University of Bradford, JustTeachers and Department of Health & Social Security.

The workshop covered what an interview consists of and their purpose; what was planned for the mock interviews two weeks later; common interview mistakes; popular interview questions; an introduction to the STAR method of answering competency based questions; role play; do's and don't's of interviews.
