<p>"Anyone can be kind Yanni" "But not everyone is though" he said. Have you ever heard of a random act of kindness? It's a movement to promote kindness around the world. How could you randomly make someone's day a little better by being kind? Make a list of things that wouldn't cost you a thing but could make someone else's day a little brighter.</p>	<p>Create a 10 question quiz for 'The Chime Seekers' and include the answers. They could be one word answers, multiple choice, putting things in order or any other kinds of questions you can think of.</p> <p>We may even use your quiz in our leading lessons in September!</p>	<p>Design a front cover and blurb for a sequel to 'The Chime Seekers' (the next book in the series).</p> <p>You will need to first think about what adventure Yanni might go on next. Then, think about what image might go on the front of your book? Will you stick to a similar colour scheme? What would your book be called? How would you entice your readers with your blurb?</p>
<p>Put together a photo collage of yourself and maybe your friends, family and even pets reading in interesting places around your house and local area.</p> <p>You could be reading 'The Chime Seekers' or you could show us what other books, magazines, newspapers, leaflets or comics you are all reading over summer.</p>	<p>Choose one of the characters at a certain point in the novel and write a diary entry to reflect on what has just happened.</p> <p>Make sure to include what they're thinking and how they feel at this moment. Remember, you are the character so try to write in first person and sound like your character too.</p>	<p>Make a model of Lorde Renwin's castle out of materials you find around your house. You could choose which version of the castle to create based on the descriptions in the book.</p> <p>Take a picture and pop it in your folder so we can see. Edible castles might be a good idea too!</p>
<p>Draw and label your favourite character with what you have learned about them, their actions in the novel and their relationships to other characters.</p> <p>You could include some quotes from the book about them and how you feel towards that character.</p>	<p>Write a short story from Yanni's perspective about his first day at his new school.</p> <p>You could start with him walking to his new school and move on to tell us about what happens to him on his first day or who he might meet.</p> <p>Try to include lots of sensory description so the reader can really imagine Yanni's experience.</p>	<p>Use your knowledge of fairies to plan, write and illustrate a story book for a toddler that features a fairy as the main character (they could be a fairy or a faerie!).</p> <p>Books for young children often use lots of rhyme, rhythm and repetition—could you include any of these in your story? If you have some plain paper or card you could actually make it into a book.</p>
