



Dear Parent/Carer

As the summer examinations are approaching with pace, I have compiled a pack of essential information to help update you of our plans to make sure the examinations are as successful as possible for your child, as well as key dates and information that you will need to be aware of as the exams get underway. This includes-

### **1. A timetable of our Masterclass sessions**

Masterclass sessions are an additional session that specialist teachers are delivering to pupils directly before they sit an exam. It will allow staff to offer key reminders, targeted advice and words of encouragement.

Prior to May half term (1 May- 22 May), pupils attend their usual timetable unless they have a scheduled exam or masterclass session.

After May half term (1 June- 16 June), pupils' usual timetable will cease but they will be expected in school for their exams and masterclass sessions. All of the evidence, from previous years, tells us that these masterclass sessions have a significant impact on the pupils' progress and their final results, therefore pupils are expected to attend these sessions. Pupils will be allowed to leave school after their exam or masterclass session. A study room will be provided if pupils wish to remain in school.

There will also be exam breakfast sessions set up before many of the exams which starts at 8.15-8.45.

### **2. An overview of the Summer Exam Series**

This is a comprehensive list of all the examinations that pupils may sit, depending on the subjects they study. This list indicates the start time, exam board, exam code and details of the subject/paper. However, personalised timetables will be issued via Edulink directly to pupils.

### **3. A copy of the rules and regulations**

These are the official documents issued by JCQ (Joint Council for Qualifications). It is imperative that pupils adhere to all of these rules and regulations as failure to do so can result in the withdrawal of their paper or entry to all future examinations.



After May half term there may be occasions where pupils are not expected in an exam or masterclass session. In this situation they have the opportunity to leave the school site. If this is not appropriate for your child, please inform the year team. During this time, we are entrusting our pupils to maintain exceptional time keeping, attend all scheduled sessions, and ensure their conduct is exemplary, in school and in the community.

I have been very impressed by the approach and attitude of our Year 11 pupils. Even though there is a little while to go, we are all incredibly proud of their maturity, commitment and ambition to achieve their best. Many pupils have been revising steadily over the last few months and are already seeing the benefits of doing so through their recent mock and Spring data.

Our Aiming High incentive will continue to recognise their efforts. Pupils are rewarded for every intervention session they attend, each week of 100% attendance, and staff award pupils the Aiming High positive on Classcharts when they are seen to go above and beyond. We are going to extend this on the lead up to the exams by awarding 2 points for every masterclass session a pupil attends. The pupil/s with the highest number of points will receive a contribution to prom. More information will be sent home regarding prom in due course. Pupils who donate their PE kits at the end of their final PE lesson will also be awarded points as we are keen to make good use of our pre-loved items and support sustainability.

I hope all our pupils have a restful Easter, so they are recharged for this upcoming important and exciting phase but do hope they maximise the opportunity for some effective revision and preparation for the upcoming examinations. There isn't long to go, but still time to make a huge difference. Below is a QR code that will take you directly to revision and support resources that we also published earlier in the year.

# Information for candidates

Written examinations

If there is anything you do not understand, especially which calculator you may use, ask your teacher.

## **A. Regulations – Make sure you understand the rules**

- 1 Be on time for all your exams. If you are late, your work might not be accepted.
- 2 **Do not** become involved in any unfair or dishonest practice during the exam.
- 3 If you try to cheat or break the rules in any way, you could be disqualified from all your exams.
- 4 You **must not** take into the exam room any unauthorised material, including:
  - (a) notes;
  - (b) earphones or earbuds (e.g. AirPods), mobile phones, MP3/4 players or similar devices, smart glasses, tablets (e.g. iPads or iPods);
  - (c) watches.

Any pencil cases taken into the exam room **must** be see-through.

**Remember: possession of unauthorised material is breaking the rules, even if you do not intend to use it, and you will be subject to sanctions and possible disqualification.**

- 5 **Do not** use correcting pens, fluid or tape, erasable pens, highlighters or gel pens in your answers.
- 6 **Do not** talk to or try to communicate with or disturb other candidates once you have entered the exam room.
- 7 You **must not** write inappropriate, obscene or offensive material.
- 8 If you leave the exam room unaccompanied by an invigilator before the exam has finished, you **will not** be allowed to return.
- 9 **Do not** borrow anything from another candidate during the exam.

## B. Information – Make sure you attend your exams and bring what you need

- 1 Know the dates and times of all your exams. Arrive at least ten minutes before the start of each exam.
- 2 If you arrive late for an exam, report to the invigilator running the exam.
- 3 If you arrive more than one hour after the published starting time for the exam, you may not be allowed to take it.
- 4 Only take into the exam room the pens, pencils, erasers and any other permitted equipment needed for the exam.
- 5 You **must** write clearly and in black ink. Coloured pencils or inks may be used only for diagrams, maps, charts, etc, unless the instructions printed on the front of the question paper state otherwise.

## C. Calculators, dictionaries and computer spellcheckers

- 1 You may use a calculator unless you are told otherwise.
- 2 If you use a calculator:
  - (a) make sure it works properly; check that the batteries are working properly;
  - (b) clear anything stored in its memory;
  - (c) remove any parts such as cases, lids or covers which have printed instructions or formulae;
  - (d) **do not** bring into the exam room any operating instructions or prepared programs.
- 3 **Do not** use a dictionary or computer spellchecker unless you are told otherwise.

## D. Instructions during the exam

- 1 Always listen to the invigilator. Always follow their instructions.
- 2 Tell the invigilator at once if:
  - (a) you think you have not been given the right question paper or all of the materials listed on the front of the paper;
  - (b) the question paper is incomplete or badly printed;
  - (c) you think you have not been given the expected access arrangement(s).
- 3 Read carefully and follow the instructions printed on the question paper and/or on the answer booklet.
- 4 **Do not** start writing anything until the invigilator tells you to fill in all the details required on the front of the question paper and/or the answer booklet. **Do not** open the question paper until you are told that the exam has begun.
- 5 Remember to write your answers within the designated sections of the answer booklet.
- 6 Do your rough work on the proper exam stationery. Cross it through and hand it in with your answers.

Make sure you add your candidate details to any additional answer sheets that you use, including those used for rough work.

## E. Advice and assistance

- 1 If, on the day of the exam, you feel that your work may be affected by ill health or any other reason, tell the invigilator.
  - 2 Put up your hand during the exam if:
    - (a) you have a problem and are not sure what you should do;
    - (b) you do not feel well;
    - (c) you need more paper.
  - 3 **You must** not ask for, and will not be given, any explanation of the questions.
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## F. At the end of the exam

- 1 If you have used more than one answer booklet and/or any supplementary answer sheets, place them in the correct order.

Place any loose additional answer sheets inside your answer booklet. Make sure you add your candidate details to any additional answer sheets that you use. For CCEA examinations, any loose additional answer sheets should be placed **behind** your script.

- 2 **Do not** leave the exam room until told to do so by the invigilator.
- 3 **Do not** take any stationery from the exam room. This includes the question paper, answer booklets (used or unused), rough work or any other materials provided for the exam.

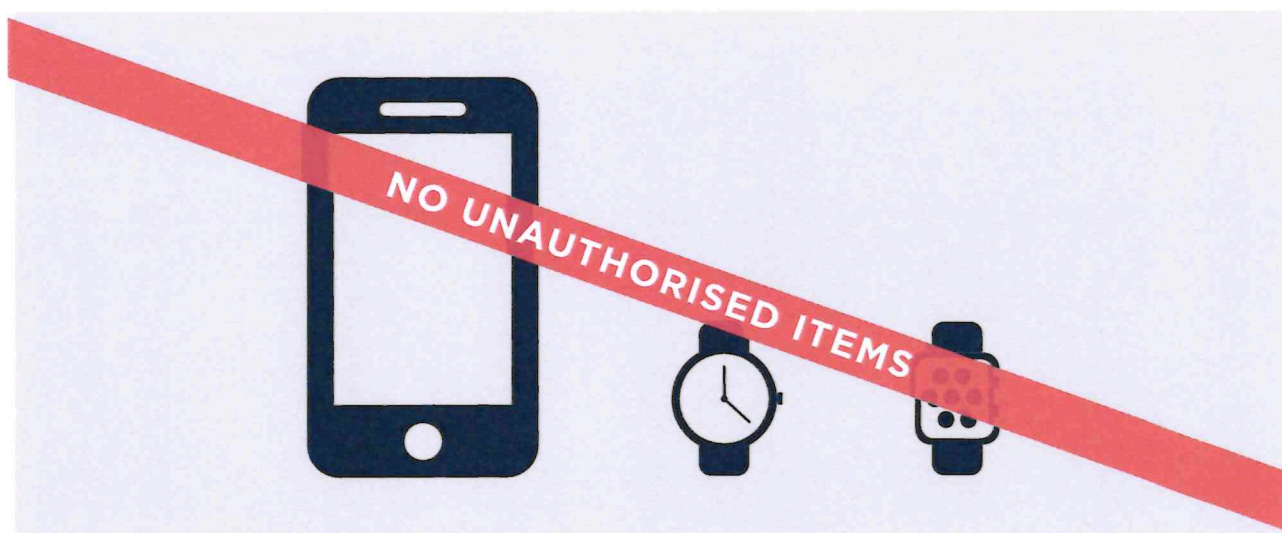
