Our visit commitment:

The Titus Salt School myVisits programme promotes values of equality and does not discriminate against any individual or group of pupils when organising a trip – however the safety of all staff and pupils is obviously our primary concern. The extracurricular trips and activities offered to pupils will provide new experiences and develop life skills. Extra-curricular visits/trips and activities are organised, managed and conducted in accordance with the school's Equality Policy.

Due to the popularity of some extra-curricular visits/trips and activities, the school runs an expression of interest process. The expression on interest period will last one week from the release of the trip information, at the end of the week it will close and the trip leader will start the selection process. Where possible, pupils will also be given the opportunity to contribute to the planning and organisation of extra-curricular trips and activities. For school trips that require payment, the fee will always be a true cost, and some help towards the costs may be provided for pupils entitled to FSM depending on the content/basis of the visit.

Due to the smaller number of places on most residential visits, it is important that these experiences are shared across as many pupils as possible. If there are more pupils wanting to go than places available, then the following process will apply:

1. If the trip directly supports a GCSE/A level course/curriculum - places will be prioritised to those **who picked/study** these subjects
2. To ensure as many pupils as possible have the opportunity for an overseas cultural visit, priority will then be given to pupils **who have not or are not** due to participate in another overseas trip. If the trip is oversubscribed pupils who have or are due to participate in another overseas trip will be placed on the reserve list.
3. Places will be **selected randomly** from the sorted lists, and other pupils will be placed on a reserve list.
